

Maths at Malvin's:

It has been lovely to see the children already getting stuck into maths these last two weeks and continuing to use concrete, pictorial and abstract resources to really deepen their learning. We have been revising some basic skills from the previous year and are now ready

Here's a fun game for you to try at home so your child notices that maths is everywhere: **Cutlery Challenge!** Challenge your child to make different shapes using their cutlery (for example you could use 3 spoons to make a triangle). Ask your child which shape they have made, how many angles it has and - for those further up the school - how many degrees in the angle?

Our Year 3 children took part in a 'Well-being festival' which was organised by Miss Alderslade from the Blyth and Bedlington School Sports Partnership. The children learned about the different ways they can keep active and look after their physical and mental health.
