Messages from Mrs Holmes:

One more week to go and we are at the end of our first half term! And what a half term it has been. I am hopeful that many of our children are over their 'calamitous colds' and are able to get back to being in school 100% of the time. I hope that in Autumn 2, we will be able to invite parents back into school for celebrations.

When we return on Monday 1st November, there will be a <u>change to collection and drop off</u> times.

The gates and doors will be open from 08:30am until 08:55am each day. EYFS and KS1 children should be dropped at their classrooms. Please do not enter the school site before 08:30am

The gates will be opened at 3:15pm each day. Please do not enter the school site before this time.

EYFS (Reception only) and KS1 children will be dismissed at this time.

KS2 children will be dismissed at 3:20pm.

Year 3 children will be dismissed from the studio door. Year 4 children will be dismissed from the LKS2 door.

Year 5 and 6 children (who are being collected) will be dismissed from the UKS2 door. Children who are walking home will be walked to the Albion Way exit at 3:20pm.

Nursery gates will be open from 3:30pm to ensure children receive their full entitlement.

Please do not let your children play with equipment at the end of the day, this includes the climbing frame.

If anyone has any <u>LEGO</u> that your children no longer use, we would really appreciate any donations for our breakfast club and nurture provision. We would also be incredibly grateful for any <u>fancy dress, WELLIES and WHEELS</u> donations for our OPAL provision.

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Remember to report your child's absence for each day that they are off school. This should be done by contacting the main school office on 01670 354082.

Children should not wear earrings for school under any circumstances

School bags - should your child need to bring a bag to school to carry a reading book/packed lunch bag then they can do so. Reading packets are preferred to carry reading books. Children should not bring bags unnecessarily e.g if they are empty. Thank you to parents for the feedback that you have given around this issue.

Children should be in PE uniform on PE days. There is no need to carry a PE uniform in a bag.

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EYFS News:

In Reception we have read the story 'Eat your greens Goldilocks'. We have learnt about being healthy. Some of the children wrote a letter to Goldilocks telling her why she needs to eat her fruit and vegetables.



We have also looked at special people who help us and learnt about a famous nurse 'Florence Nightingale'.

KS1 News:

Year 1 and 2 have had lots of fun learning their harvest song and learning what harvest is.

In Year 2, we have been looking at nouns and adjectives and focusing on our handwriting.
There has been lots of fantastic words produced to describe the pictures given.

KS2 News:

Year 3 have just finished reading their first class text, Billy and the Minpins. They have really enjoyed reading this text and using it to improve their reading skills.

E-safety Updates:

Safe online gaming tips for parents/carers

DO – Explain to your children how the online environment differs from home or the school playground. Online your children will meet total strangers – some who may not be who they say they are.

DO – know what games your children are playing online. Get involved with what your children are playing online. Ask them to show you any new games they want to play, and better still, join in yourself.

DO – take advantage of any available Parental Control settings available. These are wide-ranging controls on consoles and PCs that can allow you to limit gameplay options.

DON'T – take your children's safety for granted when they are playing online. Apply the same precautions that you would if they were playing outside the home and interacting with others.

DON'T – allow your children to meet up with 'friends' they have met while playing online – remember not everyone is who they say they are online.





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School Parliament:

After some negotiations with Mrs Holmes, led by our Prime Ministers, School Parliament have agreed an exciting new reading incentive to encourage our classes to work together to read at home. This will be announced after half term!

We also met the MP for Blyth Valley, Ian Levy, alongside the School Parliaments from Morpeth Road and Croftway. The children had the opportunity to ask Mr Levy questions about his role and also shared some juice and cakes. A lovely afternoon was had by all.


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Work celebration!
