



COLLECTION ARRANGEMENTS FROM JANUARY 2022

If you require a specific arrangement to be put in place for your child, please contact the school office on Tuesday 4th January to discuss this.

If you have a prior arrangement in place e.g. bringing a vehicle onto site to collect your child, this arrangement can remain in place.

If you bring a vehicle onto site to collect your child, you must stay in your vehicle until the children are dismissed. If you are on site/lining up before the designated dismissal time, you will be asked to return to your vehicle.

Please do not enter the site before your designated time. This causes congestion and makes dismissal extremely difficult. If you are on site unnecessarily early you will be asked to leave.

Adults should only enter the site via the Priory Grange entrance for drop off and collection.

Adults should exit via the Albion Way exit following drop off or collection.

All children are able to come to school from 08:30am

<u>Year 1</u> - collection at **15:15** from classroom door. Exit through the green gate by the back field. Follow the path around to Albion Way. Please do not congregate.

<u>Year 2</u> - collection at **15:15** from classroom door. Exit through the green gate by the back field. Follow the path around to Albion Way. Please do not congregate.

<u>Year 3</u> - collection at **15:20** from the studio. Exit through the green gate to the right. Follow the path around to Albion Way. Please do not congregate.

<u>Year 4</u> - collection at **15:20** from the LKS2 door. Exit through the green gate by the back field. Follow the path around to Albion Way. Please do not congregate.

<u>Year 5</u> - <u>for children who are collected</u> - collection at **15:25** from the UKS2 door. Exit through the green gate to the right. Follow the path around to Albion Way. Please do not congregate.

<u>Year 6</u> - <u>for children who are collected</u> - collection at **15:25** from the UKS2 door. Exit through the green gate to the right. Follow the path around to Albion Way. Please do not congregate.

UKS2 children who walk home, will be dismissed at 15:30pm from the Albion Way exit.

<u>SIBLING COLLECTION</u> - children will be brought to the USKS2 at **15:30** to be collected. Exit through the green gate to the right. Follow the path around to Albion Way. Please do not congregate.

<u>Nursery</u> - collection at **15:30** from the Nursery gate. Exit straight to the path follow the path around to Albion Way. AM Nursery collection arrangements and PM drop off arrangements are to continue as normal.

<u>Reception</u> - collection at 15:15 from the Reception gate.Please collect then exit via the gate at the bottom of the path. Follow the path around to Albion Way. Please do not congregate.

At collection time, the car park is in use. Please ensure you are appropriately supervising your children.

All KS1 and 2 children are able to enter through the UKS2 door as this makes for quicker entry. Children are able to come from the gate on their own.

Remember to report your child's absence for each day that they are off school. This should be done by contacting the main school office on 01670 354082.

Children should not wear earrings for school under any circumstances

School bags - should your child need to bring a bag to school to carry a reading book/packed lunch bag then they can do so. Reading packets are preferred to carry reading books. Children should not bring bags unnecessarily e.g if they are empty. Thank you to parents for the feedback that you have given around this issue.

Children should be in PE uniform on PE days. There is no need to carry a PE uniform in a bag.

OPAL & Outdoor play

Can all Parents/Carers please bring a pair of wellies into school for their child. There have been a number of days where children have had to miss playtime as the playing area has been too muddy for them to play in ordinary school shoes.

As the winter months are quickly heading this way and the weather is beginning to change it is going to be very wet and muddy, unfortunately if they do not have any wellies they will not be able to play in those OPAL zones. Please make sure that the wellies have your child's name inside!

<u>Head lice</u>
The holidays are the perfect time to check your child's hair for head lice. As parents/carers it is important that you are checking your child's hair regularly. As with any medical issue it is your responsibility to ensure that your child and family are treated as soon as possible if head lice or eggs are present. E-safety Updates:

With Christmas just around the corner, we thought we'd provide a little reminder about setting up appropriate parental controls for any new phones, consoles or games your child may receive.

Games/consoles

First, check the PEGI rating of any new games to check that your child is old enough to be playing them. PEGI provides age classifications for video games and considers the age suitability of a game, not the level of difficulty. It is important to note that PEGI does not take into consideration user generated content within games (such as on Roblox) and the chat facilities within games. Visit PEGI here: https://pegi.info/

For any new consoles, it is important to set up appropriate controls such as restricting spending limits and managing who they can communicate with.
