EYFS News:

Early Years have begun their new topic 'Celebrations' by learning about Halloween, Bonfire Night and Diwali! We have learned about Guy Fawkes and how he tried to blow up the Houses of Parliament, but he got caught and arrested - the King was saved and that's why every Year we have Bonfire Night 'Remember, Remember the 5th of November!' We made firework pictures and got a special visit from the Fire Service to learn about fire safety - all of the children were so excited to sit inside the Fire Engine! During Diwali, we read the story of Rama and Sita and We have learned how to make a Diva lamp for our celebration of Diwali- Diwali is called the Festival of Lights! We talked about ways that it is similar and different to Christmas and other celebrations.

KS1 News:

Year 1 has worked very hard in Maths learning all about addition fact families. They have also started a new English unit, non-chronological reports, where we found out lots of facts about reindeers. They are using brilliant adjectives in their work. We can't wait to see what work they produce next week.

In Year 2 we are enjoying our new reading text 'Flat Stanley' by Jeff Brown. We have recently discovered why Flat Stanley has been given his nickname and we are about to unfold the exciting adventures he embarks upon.

In English, we have been applying our knowledge of adjectives, nouns and conjunctions to write our own story of The Jolly Postman.

KS2 News:

This week all of KS2 children have been focusing on our termly Rising Stars test. I am so proud of how hard the children have worked and how respectful they have been whilst taking the tests.

In Year 3 the children have started our new Science topic: Animals including Humans. We had a fantastic lesson working in teams to label a human skeleton and learning all about the function of our bones.

In Year 4 the children have started their new Science unit, Animals including humans. The children have been learning about the digestive system and conducted an investigation looking at the process of digestion.



In Year 5, the children have started their new topic: Forces, and we have been





	learning all about gravity! We learnt that we are all being pulled to the centre of the Earth!
	Year 6 have been exploring evolution and adaptation. We have been exploring Darwin's concept of natural selection and the ways in which different living things have adapted to their environment.

E-safety Updates:

There is so much that we can do online nowadays including playing games, chatting with others, watching TV or sharing our videos/photographs. Being online can be great but it's important that we set boundaries for our children to keep them safe while they explore being online, develop their digital resilience and understanding of what to do if anything negative happens when online.

So how can we help keep our children safe?

We can start by checking age restrictions/ratings. It's important that we follow these to ensure that what our children are doing or seeing online is appropriate for their age.

Where can I find age ratings?

- Films: The British Board of Film Classification (BBFC) rate films. This page includes a link to a 'Parents' Guide to Age Ratings': https://www.cbbfc.co.uk/resources/viewing-films-safely-online.
- Video games: PEGI provides age classifications for video games. PEGI considers the age suitability of a game, not the level of difficulty. It is important to note that PEGI do not take into consideration user generated content within games (such as on Roblox) and the chat facilities within games.
- Apps: Check the individual age ratings within the relevant app store. We also recommend that you download any apps and play them yourself to check their suitability.
- Social Media networks: All social media networks have a minimum age rating; they are all at least
 13+

What else can I do?

- Explain the importance of age ratings to your child.
- Go online together and let your child show you what they are accessing online.
- Set up parental controls on your broadband, devices, consoles and on any individual apps that your child is using. This will reduce the chances of them accessing anything unsuitable as well as viewing inappropriate content for example whilst on YouTube.
- Chat to your child regularly about what they are doing online and as always, remind your child that
 if anything is worrying them about what they see online then they should tell you or another trusted
 adult.

Top tips for reading with your child at home

As we all know, there is a lot more to reading than just reading! Here are some tips to help during reading sessions when reading with your child at home.

- What is happening? Talk about what is happening in the pictures before you read the text. What can you see?
- Discuss the meaning of words. Use a dictionary to help your child explore words for themselves.
- Discuss alternative words. For example, 'big'. Ask your child to think of another word that means the same, e.g. 'huge' (you could use a thesaurus).

What we're reading at Malvin's:

In Year 6 we are reading Pig Heart Boy: a story about a controversial but potentially life saving operation. The children are thoroughly enjoying having debates around themes within the book.

Family Team Update

Young Carers:

We are working closely with Young Carers Northumberland to ensure that we can identify any children in need of support.

A young carer is someone under 18 who helps look after a family member or friend who is ill, disabled, has a mental health condition or misuses drugs or alcohol.

A young carer may help with practical tasks such as shopping or cooking, or may support with physical or personal care such as helping someone get dressed.

They may help provide emotional support, help someone communicate, or provide support in other ways.

Young carers Northumberland support in lots of ways; children can access grants to take part in activities, go out on day trips, spend time with other young carers, along with many other things. If you feel that your child may benefit from support please contact the school family team.

Parent Workshop:

On Thursday 2nd December at 9.00am we will be holding a parent workshop in the school hall with Educational Psychologist, Honor Parker. This will be a 45 minute session focussing on what resilience is and ways in which adults can support children to develop their resilience. Coffee/tea and biscuits.
