Remember to report your child's absence for each day that they are off school. This should be done by contacting the main school office on 01670 354082.

Please do not report your child's absence by email, all absences must be reported in person or by calling the School office.

Failure to report an absence will result in a home visit. All children should aim to have 100% attendance.



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Attendance Procedures from September

School attendance has a significant impact on the well-being, attainment and progress of children.

You must complete a leave of absence form when you take your child out of school for holidays/sporting events/bereavements/family circumstances. These are available from the office

You must contact school before 9am on the morning of your child's absence from school. School has an answer phone if you need to ring earlier.

School will contact you if no contact is made with school, if we are unable to contact you we will then contact the rest of your emergency contacts as this is part of our safeguarding policy.

Home visits will be made daily if we are unable to make contact regarding your child's absence.

If your child is absent five days a home visit will be carried out by the Pastoral Team.

Regular updates will be sent throughout the year regarding your child's attendance.

Lateness and punctuality - The doors close at 8.55am if your child arrives after that time they will be marked as late.

If you have to collect your child up early for an appointment, proof of appointment must be shown.

Any concerns raised by school regarding your child's attendance may be addressed initially by a letter and these following stages:

- Letters
- You may need to provide Medical Evidence
- Attendance meeting invite
- Referral to Education Welfare Officer

Holidays/Leave of Absence

You must complete a leave of absence form when you take your child out of school for holidays/sporting events/bereavements/family circumstances, forms are available from the office. Failure to complete a form could result in a Fixed Penalty Notice being issued from Northumberland County Council.

Please note all Holidays are marked as Unauthorised. All unauthorised absences, including those taken as part of a holiday request, will be taken into account when a Fixed Penalty Notice is issued. Fixed Penalty Notices will be issued in conjunction with the Education Welfare Team and Northumberland County Council.

Maths at Malvin's:

The quick recall of multiplication and division facts (times tables) is essential for all children. The ability to recall these facts quickly enables children to answer related questions with ease. According to the National Curriculum the expectation of times tables in each year group is as follows:

- Year 1: Count in multiples of 2, 5 and 10.
- Year 2: 2x, 5x, 10x
- Year 3: 3x, 4x, 8x
- Year 4: All x and ÷ facts up to 12x12
- Year 5 and 6: Revision of all x and ÷ facts up to 12x12



To support with times tables we use Times Table Rock Stars. TTRS is a fun and challenging programme designed to help pupils master the times tables! Your child's teacher has introduced them to how Times Tables Rock Stars works and they use it regularly in class. This programme can be accessed online via the <u>web address</u> or you may also download the app. Your child has their own login and password. It is recommended that your child does a little bit of times table practice every day. Thank you for your support and I am sure your hard work and theirs will have a direct impact and make them a Times Table Rock Star!

What is a Designated Safeguarding Lead?

Governing bodies should ensure that the school or college designates an appropriate senior member of staff to take lead responsibility for child protection.

Key aspects of the 'Designated Safeguarding Lead' role include:

- Making sure all staff are aware how to raise safeguarding concerns
- Ensuring all staff understand the symptoms of child abuse and neglect
- Referring any concerns to social care
- Monitoring children who are the subject of child protection plans
- Maintaining accurate and secure child protection records

- Raising awareness of the school's safeguarding policies and procedures, and ensuring they are implemented and reviewed regularly
