A Love of Reading

As part of our love for reading, each phase has an exciting approach to introduce! We encourage children to read as often as possible, including a variety of genres and purposes. Thank you for your ongoing support to continue this at home.

EYFS, Nursery:	Please read and return their share a story book weekly. Also read story books every night.
EYFS,Reception:	Daily reading of their reading book and read red word book. Please also read their budding bookworm book. Golden Dojos for weekly reading when books are signed.
KS1, Y1 & Y2:	Read daily with an adult at home with their story book and their reading diary must be signed by an adult. All children will get one ticket in the box if they return their book signed (tickets will be put into a draw for a prize).
LKS2, Y3 & Y4:	Read 3 times per week at home and have the reading record book signed by an adult – one ticket in the box if they complete the challenge (tickets will be put into a draw for some exciting prizes!)
UKS2,Y5& 6:	Read 3 times per week at home and have the reading record book signed by an adult – one ticket in the box if they complete the challenge (tickets will be put into a draw for some exciting prizes!)

'Age ratings are useful to help you decide what is appropriate for your child. You are probably familiar with the age ratings used for films, but apps and games are rated differently and there is lots more to consider. Some ratings give a minimum age, some use categories (such as Amazon app stores 'guidance suggested' category). NSPCC.

In school all classes from Reception to Y6 also have half termly E-Safety lessons where we discuss how to stay safe online, who to report any concerns to and how we keep children safe in school with our filtering and monitoring system: SENSO.
