- increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
- the engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity - the Chief Medical Officer guidelines recommend that all children and young people aged 5 to 18 engage in at least 60 minutes of physical activity a day, of which 30 minutes should be in school
- the profile of PE and sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole-school improvement
- broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
- increased participation in competitive sport

The funding each school receives is derived from the January census for Y1 to Y6 pupils. Malvin's Close Academy was allocated £19,420 in the financial year 2025 - 2026.
